
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Horizontal Niches, Headwalls, Footwalls

A megatile consists of a piece of 1/4" tempered glass or 1/4" clear acrylic with artwork printed second surface, plus opaque backings. A megatile can be adhered directly to a wall or to most other substrates (permanent installation). Alternatively, a megatile can be affixed to a wall or substrate with wall-mount anchors and standoff caps (removable installation).



Process for Adhering Panels:

- 1. First, dry fit the panel(s) in the space.
- 2. Next, apply the VHB tape and silicone to Megatile.
- 3. Carefully adhere the panels to the wall (start at the bottom of the panel).
- 4. Some top and bottom capture is required to help hold the megatile in place.
 - Wall should be perfectly flat at a level 5 drywall finish.
 - Wall must also be primed and painted using a semigloss latex paint to accept VHB and silicone adhesives. Paint must be allowed to outgas for 10 days prior to application.
 - If opening is out of square, megatile can be produced out of square for an upcharge.

Process for Affixing Panels:

- 1. First, dry fit the panel(s) in the space.
- 2. Next, drill holes in the wall, and set wall-mount anchors.
- 3. Carefully place panels on wall-mount anchors, and secure with caps.
 - Wall should be flat at a level 4 drywall finish.
 - If opening is out of square, megatile can be produced out of square for an upcharge.
